National Anti-Bullying Week – “All different. All equal”

The week commencing Monday 13th November is National Anti-Bullying Week, with the theme “All different. All equal”. At Northwood we believe that the behaviour and safety of our children is our prime concern and we ensure that this week is a real feature of the curriculum. Children across the school will engage in a range of activities to understand how to keep themselves safe from any sort of bullying either in school, out in the community or online. As part of my statutory duty all families will receive a copy of the school’s Anti-Bullying Policy this week. I ask that you take the time to read this to fully understand the procedures that we adopt at Northwood Primary School if any incident of bullying arises.



Attendance Matters

Whole School Attendance for last half term was 94%.

The national target for attendance is 96.6%, so as a school we still have a way to go to improve our overall figures. Ofsted make a link between attendance and the quality of the school.

Our weekly incentives continue including ‘Choc Ice Friday’ and the ‘Weekly Book Raffle’. Please remember that Paula our Parent Support Adviser is available to discuss any concerns you have getting your children to school.

Year 6 Booster sessions

Teachers from across the school are committed to ensuring that children in Year 6 are given the best chance possible to be successful in their end of year tests and be secondary ready. All children in Year 6 will benefit from booster sessions in key subject areas across this half term and into the spring term. If your child has been selected it is vital that they complete all sessions in order to develop the necessary skills in subjects where they may be experiencing difficulty. I thank all parents for their support in ensuring that these sessions are successful.



Children in Need Day at Northwood

On Friday 17th November it is Children in Need Day and as always Northwood will be celebrating in style. The theme this year is ‘Get Spotty and Be Noticed’ and I invite the whole school community to come dressed in spotty clothes or bright colours. As this is a worthwhile cause I am asking for a small donation for the charity. Last year we raised over £100 for this worthwhile charity.

National Road Safety Week at Northwood

The week commencing Monday 20th November is National Road Safety Week and the theme this year is 'Speed Down. Save Lives'. With the onset of the dark nights it is really important that our children are aware of how to keep safe, especially near roads. The focus during this week will be to help raise awareness of the dangers posed by speeding drivers.
