A Message from Mrs Beach, Executive Head Teacher

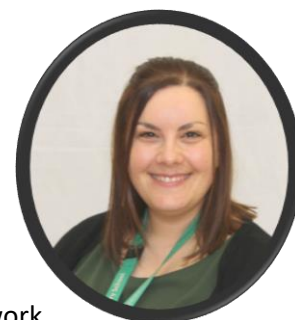

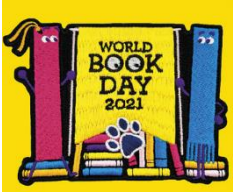
Parent Consultations – Reception, Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5, Y6

We would normally hold our parent consultations in the second week back of this half-term, however, with all children returning to school on March 8th we are holding them slightly later this time. Parent consultations will take place on **Tuesday 16th March** and **Wednesday 17th March**. Due to the success of our November consultations and the current national restrictions, we will be organising virtual meetings again. You will receive an email or letter asking you to choose either a Teams meeting or a phone call meeting on one of these nights. If your child’s teacher does not receive a reply from you, they will allocate you a phone call appointment and inform you of when this will be. By the time the consultations happen all children will have been back at school for just over a week so the teachers will be able to chat to you about your child’s progress to date and how they have settled in if they have just returned.

Remote Learning Survey

At Northwood we are always striving to do things as well as we can. Thank you to all parents who completed our Remote Learning Survey and gave us really valuable feedback on what we are doing well and areas we can improve. We are really pleased that 92% of people who responded were happy with the offer we have provided so far. Once all children return to school on March 8th, there may still be occasions where classes have to isolate and learn from home. Your feedback will help us to shape what this looks like to make our offer for all children brilliant. World Book Day – 4th March/ 12th March



World Book Day is always something we look forward to at Northwood – the staff as much as the children! Reading is at the heart of our curriculum and World Book Day gives us an opportunity to celebrate it. This year the official World Book Day (at the time of writing this newsletter) is on Thursday 4th March. Whilst we will still complete themed activities on this day, we thought it would be best to postpone our usual dress up day until the following week

when all children are back in school so we can celebrate together. Northwood's World Book Day will be **Friday 12th March**. On this day it would be wonderful if as many children as possible could dress up as their favourite book character and/ or bring their favourite book into school. I know that the supermarkets are full of dressing up costumes at the minute but please don't feel you need to spend money on a costume. Why not get creative yourself or challenge your child to make a costume with things around the house!
